

MONTHLY COFFEE REPORT-JUNE 2025

COFFEE YEAR 2024/25- ISSUE 9

Key Highlights



A total of 1,014,062 60-kilo bags of coffee valued at US\$ 289.60 million were exported in June 2025 at an average price of US\$ 4.76/kilogram, US cents 36 lower than US\$ 5.12/Kilogram in May 2025, and US cents 70 higher than US\$ 4.06/kilogram in June 2024. This was an increase of 51.90% and 78.09% in quantity and value respectively compared to the same month last year.

Farm-gate prices for Robusta Kiboko averaged UGX **5,750** per kilogram; FAQ UGX **11,500** per kilogram, Arabica parchment UGX **14,000** per kilogram and Drugar UGX **13,500** per kilogram.



Coffee exports for twelve months (Financial year 2024/25) totaled 7.77 million bags worth US\$ 2.22 billion compared to 6.13 million bags worth US\$ 1.14 billion in the previous year (Financial year 2023/24). This represents an increase of 26.88% and 93.66% in quantity and value respectively.



68% of the export total volume was exported by top 10 exporters, out of 91 companies which performed during the month compared to 65% in the month of May 2025.

Sustainable Arabica had the highest price at US \$ 8.61 per kilogram.

1. Coffee exports

Coffee exports in June 2025, amounted to 1,014,062 bags worth US\$ 289.60 million. This comprised of 907,058 bags of Robusta valued at US\$ 248.57 million and 107,006 bags of Arabica valued at US\$ 41.03 million (see Table 1 and Annex 1). This was an increase of 51.90% and 78.09% in quantity and value respectively compared to the same month last year. By comparing quantity of coffee exported by type in the same month of last year (June 2024), Robusta increased by 47.56% and 65.60% in quantity and value respectively, while Arabica exports increased by 102.35% and 227.96% in quantity and value respectively.

Coffee exports were higher than the previous year on account of a good crop harvest in most coffee growing regions especially Greater Masaka and South Western Regions. The value of coffee was higher due to the high global coffee prices that were prompted by supply concerns in Brazil and Vietnam as the two biggest producers of Arabica coffee and Robusta coffee respectively experienced prolonged dry weather conditions.

Coffee exports for twelve months (Financial Year 2024/25) totaled 7.77 million bags worth US\$ 2.22 billion compared to 6.13 million bags worth US\$ 1.14 billion in the previous year (Financial year 2023/24). This represents an increase of 26.88% and 93.66% in quantity and value respectively.

Fig 1: Trend of Total Quantity and Value of Coffee Exports, July 2024- June 2025

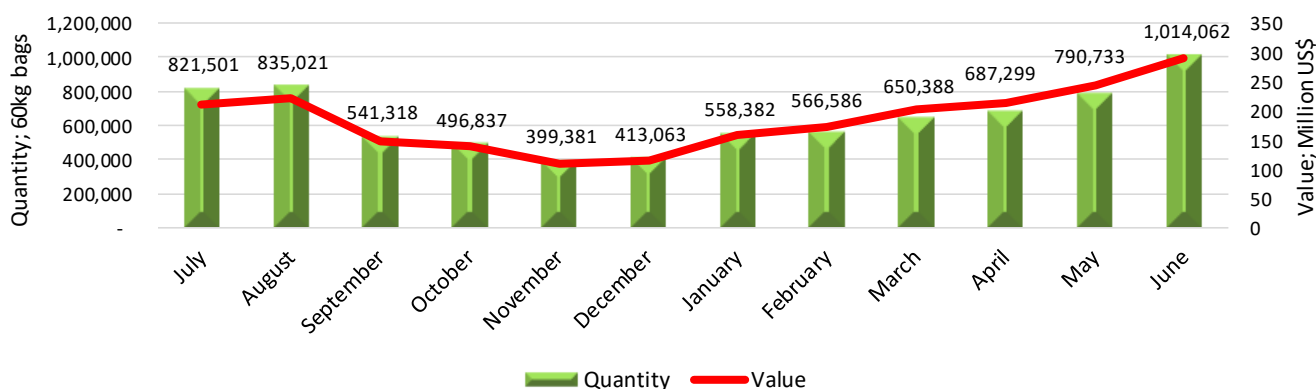

2. Exports by Type and Grade

Table 2 shows coffee exports by type, grade and average realized price for each grade during the month of June 2025. The average export price was US\$ 4.76 per kilogram, US cents 36 lower than in May 2025 (US\$ 5.12). It was US cents 70 higher than in June 2024 (US \$ 4.06/kilogram). Robusta exports accounted for 89% of total exports, higher than 87% in April 2025. The average Robusta price was US\$ 4.57 per kilogram, 34 cents lower than US\$ 4.91 per kilo the previous month. The highest price was for Washed Robusta sold at US\$ 5.39 per kilogram, followed by Screen 14 sold at US\$ 4.91 per kilogram.

The share of Sustainable/washed coffee to total Robusta exports was 0.22% lower than 028% in May 2025.

Arabica fetched an average price of US\$ 6.39 per kilogram US cents 20 lower than the previous month (US\$ 6.59). The highest price was for Sustainable Arabica sold at US\$ 8.61 per kilogram. It was followed by Wugar sold at US\$ 7.66 per kilo. Drugar was sold at US\$ 6.35 per kilogram, 15 cents lower than US\$ 6.50 per kilogram the previous month. Drugar exports were 63% of total Arabica exports higher than 55% the previous month. The share of sustainable Arabica exports to total Arabica exports was 2%, lower than 8% in May 2025.

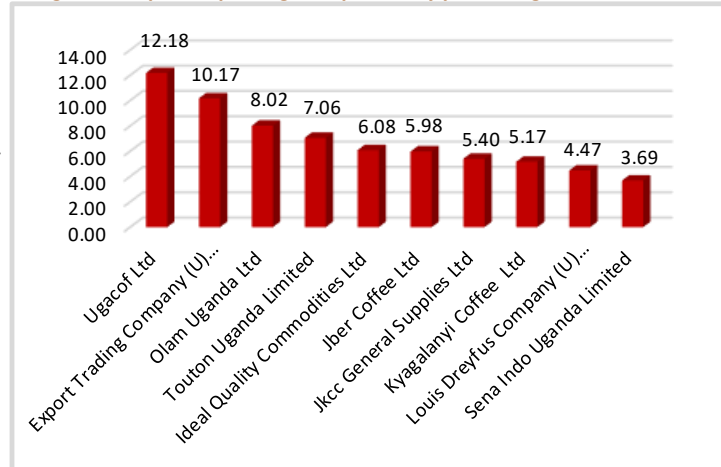

3. Individual Exporter Performance

Figure 2 shows the top 10 export companies' performance in the month of June 2025. Ugacof (U) Ltd had the highest market share of 12.18% compared to 13.00% in May 2025. It was followed by Export Trading Company (U) Ltd 10.17% (6.96%), Olam Uganda Ltd 8.02% (6.69%), Touton Uganda Limited 7.06% (7.12%) Ideal Quality Commodities Ltd 6.08%(5.89%), Jber Coffee Ltd 5.98% (5.98%), JKCC General Supplies Ltd 5.40% (5.24%), JKCC General Supplies Ltd 5.40% (5.40%), Kyagalanyi Coffee Ltd 5.17% (5.53%), Louis Dreyfus Company (U) Ltd 4.47% (4.69%) and Sena Indo Uganda Limited 3.69% (2.57%) **The figures in brackets represent percentage market share held in May 2025.*

The top 10 exporters held a market share of 68% higher than 65% the previous month reflecting competition at exporter level. Out of the 91 exporters who performed, 56 exported Robusta Coffee only while 14 exported Arabica coffee only. **Annex 2** shows a detailed list of exporters' performance in June 2025.

4. Coffee Exports By Destination

The destinations of Uganda's coffee exports during the month of June 2025 are shown in **Fig 3** (details in **Annex 3**). Italy maintained the highest market share with 34.67% compared to 39.23% last month. It was followed by Germany 12.22% (9.38%), Sudan 7.80% (7.15%), Spain 4.85% (5.17%), and India 4.36% (3.95%). **The figures in brackets represent percentage market share held in May 2025.* The first 10 major destinations of Uganda coffee took a market share of 79.19% compared to 82.65% the previous month. Coffee exports to African countries totaled 169,663 bags, a market share of 16% compared to 144,042 bags (18%) the previous month. African countries that imported Uganda coffee included Sudan, Algeria, Morocco, Egypt, Tunisia, Kenya, Libya and South Africa, . Europe remained the main destination for Uganda's coffees with a 68% import share, higher than 67% in May 2025.

Figure 3: Top ten export destinations by percentage market share

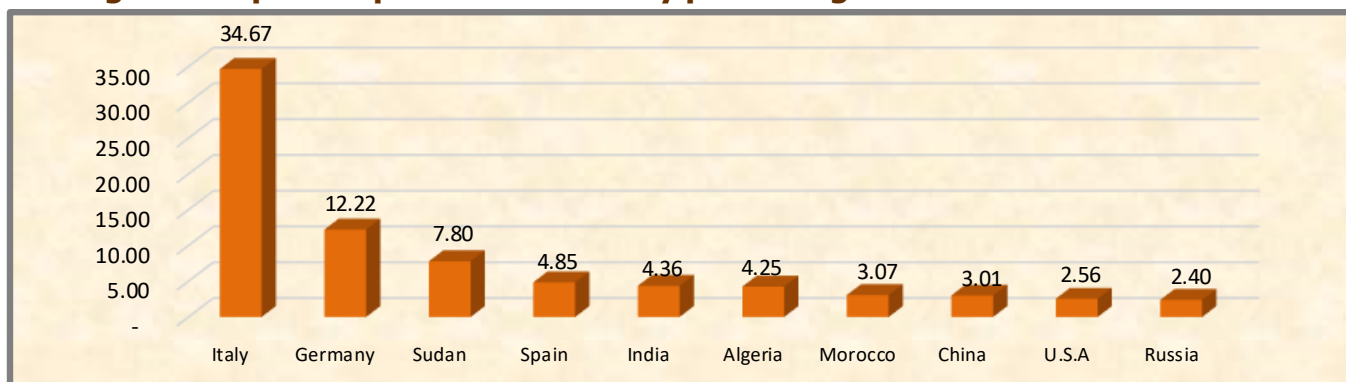


Figure 4: Percentage share of Uganda's coffee imported by continent

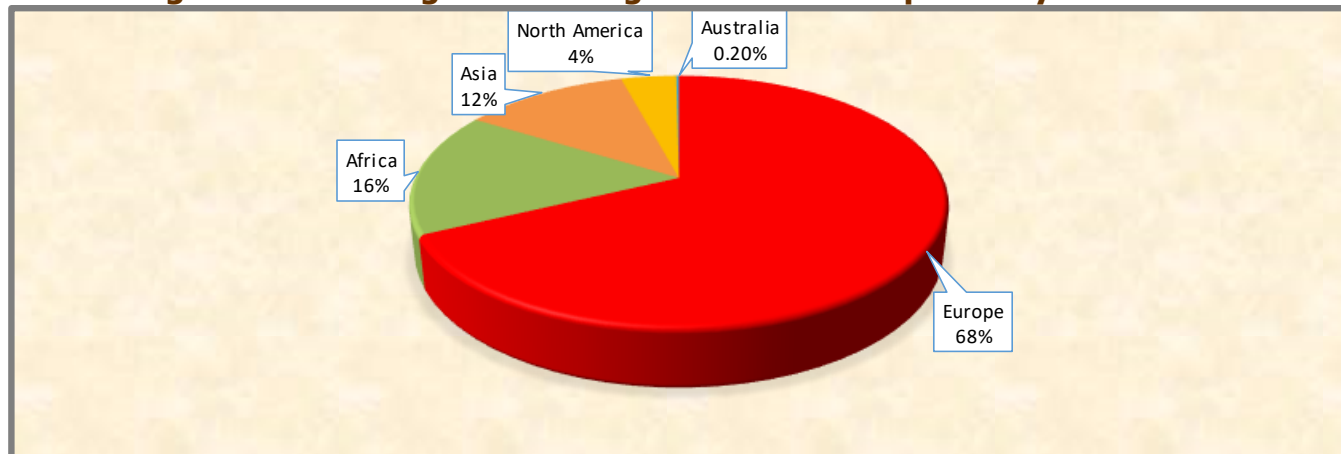
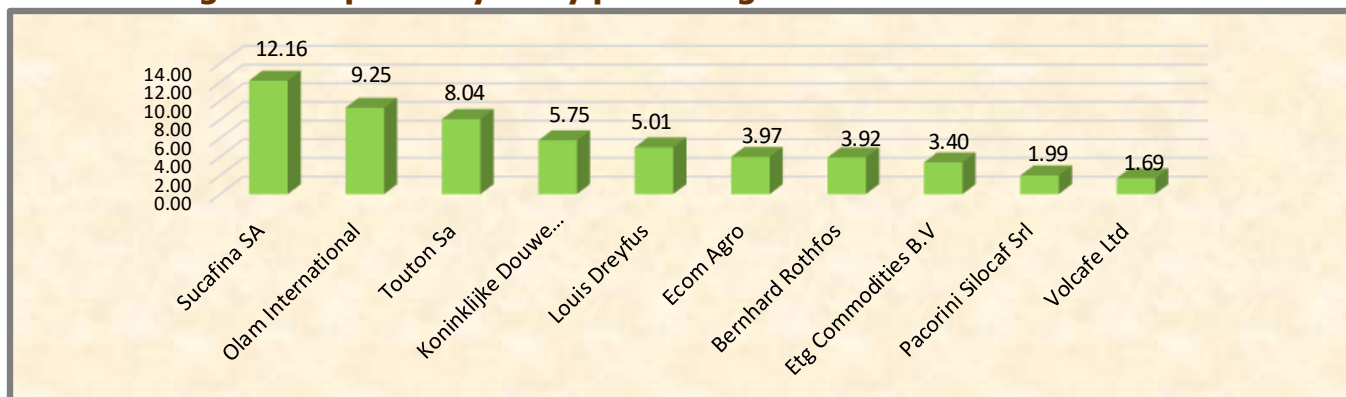


Figure 5: Top ten buyers by percentage market share



5. Foreign buyers of Uganda Coffee

Annex 4 shows a list of Uganda coffee foreign buyers in June 2025. The top 10 buyers held a market share of 55.19% higher than 51.74% the previous month. Sucafina led with a market share of 12.15% compared to 13.04% in May 2025. It was followed by Olam International 9.25% (7.67%); Touton SA 8.04% (7.57%); Koninklijke Douwe Egberts 5.75% (1.86%); Louis Dreyfus 5.01% (5.42%) Ecom Agro Industrialst 3.97% (4.69%); Bernhard Rothfos 3.92% (3.49%) ETG Commodities B.V 3.40% (0.67%), Pacorin Silocaf 1.99% (4.17%) and Volcafe Ltd 1.69% (1.96%); *The figures in brackets represent percentage market share held in May 2025*

6. Global Situation

World coffee production for 2025/26 is forecast 4.3 million bags higher than the previous year to a record 178.7 million due to continued recovery in Vietnam and Indonesia as well as record output in Ethiopia. World coffee bean exports are forecast 700,000 bags higher to 122.3 million as gains from Vietnam, Ethiopia, and Indonesia more than offset losses from Brazil and Colombia. With global consumption forecast at a record 169.4 million bags, ending inventories are expected to remain tight at 22.8 million bag. (United States Department of Agriculture, Coffee: World Markets and Trade report-June 2025).

8. Coffee Consumption and Promotional Activities.

Uganda (MAAIF) participated in the World of Coffee Geneva 2025, that was held from 26th to the 28th June 2025. It is Europe's premier specialty coffee trade show, that brings together coffee professionals across the value chain actors including producers, roasters, baristas, equipment manufacturers, and buyers. Uganda's participation was aimed at promoting Uganda's specialty Arabica and fine, enhance market access for private sector players producing specialty/ fine and commercial coffees, and increase visibility of Uganda as a coffee producer. Key highlights of the event included Coffee Championships, cupping sessions, educational lectures, workshops, and showcases of innovative products and brewing technologies.

During the period, the Ugandan Delegation led by the Minister of State for Agriculture, and the Deputy Permanent Representative to the UN Mission in Geneva held a meeting with the Deputy Executive Director for the International Trade Centre, and her Technical team. In the meeting, Uganda presented a case for support in four key areas that were assented to and there were; Promoting Domestic Consumption of coffee both in-country and within the region, partnership facilitation for off-takers of value added coffee from Uganda, linkage to investors to support scaling and value addition and technology transfer. The Ugandan delegation also held a meeting with the top leadership of Sucafina, a top buyer of Uganda's coffee where a case for partnership in value addition was made with a reassurance of sustainably increased coffee production in Uganda. The Sucafina team led by their CEO, pledged their support in addressing the issue of increased value addition to the Ugandan Coffee Value Chain.

During the month MAAIF participated in the 31st National Agriculture show in Jinja where value addition across the coffee chain was demonstrated. As part of promoting coffee consumption over 3000 cups of coffee were served, displayed roasted coffee brands, and disseminated information on health benefits of drinking coffee. Extension services at the demo garden were also given to the visitors. The cocoa value chain, cocoa products that included chocolates, cocoa powder, cocoa butter, and wine were also showcased under the COCODEV project.

7. Local Situation

During the month of June 2025, farm gate prices ranged from UGX 5,500/= - 6,000/= per kilogram of Kiboko (Robusta dry cherries); UGX.11,000/= - 12,000/= for FAQ (Fair Average Quality); UGX. 13,500- 14,500/= for Arabica Parchment; and UGX 13,000/- 14,000/= per kilogram for Drugar. Robusta Kiboko averaged UGX 5,750/= lower than UGX 6,250/= Robusta FAQ averaged UGX 11,500/= lower than UGX 13,750, Arabica parchment UGX 14,000 per kilogram, the same as the previous month Drugar UGX 13,500/= per kilogram lower than 13,750/= per kilogram

9. Coffee Development Activities

During June 2025, Uganda's coffee sector recorded notable progress through targeted interventions aimed at enhancing productivity, sustainability, and quality along the value chain. A total of 2,862 farmers across all major coffee-growing regions benefited from 72 specialized training sessions. These trainings focused on critical topics such as Good Agricultural Practices (GAPs), Sustainable Land Management (SLM), Climate-Smart Agriculture, and Environmental Management.

As part of the extension services, 259 farm visits were conducted, directly engaging 1,403 farmers. These visits provided on-the-spot technical guidance, supported disease surveillance, and facilitated the implementation of GAPs.

To inform soil fertility improvement efforts, 105 soil samples were analyzed across key regions: Greater Masaka (51), South West (16), Northern (26), and Elgon (12).

Eight sensitization workshops on good post-harvest handling practices for maintaining and enhancing coffee quality were held, reaching 101 participants in the Northern, Western, Rwenzori, and Kigezi regions.

Three mini taskforces were deployed to address compliance and quality assurance in South Western, Rwenzori, and Greater Masaka regions. As part of ongoing regulatory efforts, 359 value chain actors were inspected, including: 217 coffee factories, 124 coffee stores, 15 wet mills and 3 roasteries. From these inspections, a total of 173 coffee value chain operators were registered for licensing.

10. Outlook for July 2025

Uganda's Coffee exports are projected to reach 900,000 60-kilo bags. The main harvest season in Greater Masaka and south west and the fly crop North of equator is at the tail end. The ministry assessment finding indicate that farmers and traders are holding their stocks as they wait for any improvement in the coffee prices.
